Teen dating violence is more common than anyone wants to believe. Too many teenagers are not aware of the signs of unhealthy relationships or where to go for help. RESPOND, Inc. looks to help educate you, your children and others on teen dating violence (TDV). If you are interested in learning more about prevention and supporting young adults, RESPOND would love to help you do so. Here are just a few ways we would like to help:

- Call our Hotline- We have counselors available 24 hours a day to speak with you confidentially.
 We can provide extra support to you and/or your children. Our counselors can help you
 recognize or interpret warning signs and can help you to plan the best approach for supporting
 your child. Words and actions can be very important when addressing this topic, and we are
 more than happy to share advice on how to start the conversation and have a positive impact
 on your child's relationship.
- Presentations and Workshops (for young adults) We can design learning opportunities for
 groups large or small that address healthy relationships, define TDV, warning signs, and offer
 alternatives and support for your children. If your local school, library, or other community
 center would be willing to host something, we can provide the programming
- Parent Education- In addition to speaking with the young adults themselves, we can prepare a
 presentation or workshop that is designed to help parents and other adults better understand
 TDV and how to support their children. These have more a focus on intervention and
 communication so that adults can be more comfortable addressing this sometimes difficult topic
 with their children or other young adults in their lives.
